Sleep Mask

This sleep mask is a fast and easy project for makers of all abilities and a great way to use up some scraps. Perfect for travel, daytime naps, or just a luxurious night of rest, plus it makes a great gift.

Machine Requirements

- 1. PFAFF sewing machine.
- 2. 22cm (w) x 11cm (h) Satin, viscose, or cotton (for outer layer)
- 3. 22cm (w) x 11cm (h) Satin (for lining)
- 4. 22cm (w) x 11cm (h) Lightweight iron on batting
- 5. PFAFF Universal Sewing Machine Needles
- 6. Approx. 35cm lingerie elastic
- 7. General Sewing Equipment

Cutting Instructions


- 1. Cut the pattern template at end of the notes
- 2. Cut out your pieces:
 - a. One outer fabric
 - b. One lining
 - c. One batting
- 3. Trim batting 1cm around edges.

Sewing Instructions

- 1. Iron on batting to wrong side of outer fabric. Picture 1.
- 2. Pin and sew elastic to outer fabric with right sides together, ensuring the elastic is not twisted. Picture 2.
- 3. Pin and sew outer fabric and lining, right sides together using a 1cm seam allowance and leaving a 5cm hole (for turning mask inside out). Your elastic will be enclosed within your mask at this point. Picture 3.








HINT: When sewing multiple or thick layers together, engage you IDT[™] . The time-tested PFAFF original IDT[™] system guarantees the optimal feed you expect





on all types of fabric with absolutely even fabric feed from both the top and bottom.

- 4. Trim seams to .5cm and cut small notches (triangles) around curves, being careful not to cut the stitching. Picture 4.
- 5. Turn mask right side out you are almost finished! Picture 5.
- 6. Press, ensuring the lining is not visible from the front. Picture 6.

 Hand-sew the hole closed using a ladder stitch OR machine top-stitch around the edges of your mask, closing the hole with your top stitching. I chose to top stitch .5cm from the edges.

- 8. Press once more for a neat finish.
- 9. Try on your mask and (if the time is right) have a sneaky snooze!
